# In Memoriam\*

#### FOR THE REPOSE OF THE SOUL OF MICHAEL KELLY

The compassion committee asks each brother to pray for Mr. Kelly and a deceased service member. Please consider the following intention.

PRAYER INTENTION: GIVE A LOVED ONE OR A DECEASED VET-ERAN OR SERVICE MEMBER A TICKET HOME.

On Memorial Day, we paused to honor all those in service of this country and those who serve others who have died. In honoring and remembering their service and sacrifices to keep us safe we honor ourselves. We Hibernians have had three deaths recently. Mr. Michael Kelly, brother-inlaw of Jim Dunn has died. Please keep him, his family and Jim in your prayer intentions. The other two deceased were Hibernians

of the Fr. Judge Division in Triangle and the Major Dooley Division here in Richmond. With these events in mind the following prayer intention is proposed to each member of the division.

This intention comes in three parts.

First, our Catholic faith gives us a special opportunity to express our gratitude to those who either sacrificed their lives in protecting our country or dedicated their lives to the service of this country and are now deceased. We can obtain for them or for a beloved family member that has passed on, a plenary indulgence. The church requirements to earn a plenary indulgence are as follows: (a) one must be a baptized Catholic, (b) one must be in the state of grace, (c) one must desire to earn a plenary indulgence, (d) one must renounce all attachment to sin, (e) one must receive holy communion on **that day** that one is asking for the indulgence, (f) one must have a recent confession, i.e. one must have either gone to confession or will go to confession within eight days of the date that he requested the indulgence, (g) one must say some prayers for the intentions of our holy father, i.e. one Our Father, three Hail Marys and a Glory Be, and (h) one must complete a devotion recognized by the church. Examples of such devotions are : praying a group rosary, or 1/2hour of adoration before the Blessed Sacrament, or 1/2 hour of reading the bible, or completing the way of the cross in church. Obtaining a plenary indulgence for a deceased family member means that person is released from all pains and torment of purgatory and is received by almighty God to their

home in heaven. Considering that you may not have suffered the loss of a loved one recently, what better way to show your gratitude to someone who lost their life in the past year, in our nation's service, than to pray for a plenary indulgence for the repose of their soul.

The second part of this intention is to pray for those who have come back from hazardous duty areas severely wounded. Those military men and women of the Wounded Warrior Project who have paid and will pay a continuing price for our freedoms every day of their lives. we should never forget them.

The third part of this intention is for all of the families of those deceased and those wounded warriors as well as all those who are trying to help them.

God watch over and protect them all. In our motto.
