The most unusual events I saw last year were the pole-toss and the beer-barrel-throw! So if you are not into pole or barrel tossing you can still get into spirit with the raffle ticket sales program!

As luck would have it, there is also the 45th Annual Richmond Oktoberfest on the 18th and 19th at the Old Dominion Building at RIR. There is a discount for the participants in the Celtic Festival to attend this event. Check the web site for more information on the <u>OktoberFest</u>. The Celtic festival is also the kick-off for the "**Trip to Ireland**" raffle ticket sale. It is, by far, our biggest money maker for the division. I have contacted Tim McDonald of the Dooley Division and have put in a request for 250 tickets. We keep five bucks for each ticket sold. This is a wonderful opportunity for us and we owe a debt of 'Thanks" to the Dooley Division for allowing us to piggy-back with them on this event.

We will need help setting up our 12 ft. x12 ft. shelter on Friday, October 18th, sometime between Noon and 4 PM. We will have a table and three chairs supplied by the event organizers. If more items are needed, we will need to bring them.

We also need folks to man the shelter in four-hour shifts, if possible. The sign-up list will be sent out separately. We have been supplied with two parking passes and four personal clan passes. The parking passes are nice, but not critical for parking is not that big a problem. The clan passes are important and somewhat costly. If I remember correctly, they are in the range of \$25 per person per day. Since we have four passes, we can transfer them across the gated area

between members. A little cell-phone coordination is all that is needed for this to work smoothly. The web site for the Celtic Festival is www.vacelticfestival.com. I recommend visiting the site, for there is a boat-load of activities at the festival, ranging from blacksmith demonstrations to whisky tasting!




